






## **Young Eagles Flight Rally**

EAA Chapter 526 conducted a Young Eagles Flight Rally on Saturday July 17, 2021. The event was held in the EAA Chapter 526 Hangar at Auburn airport. The National EAA Young Eagles Program has dedicated more than 25 years to giving youth ages 8–17 their first free ride in an airplane. It's the only program of its kind, with the sole mission to introduce and inspire kids in the world of aviation.

During the Auburn rally 36 kids were flown on 26 flights. Eight airplanes were available. The parents and children were introduced to the aircraft preflight process, aircraft safety procedures and basic flight control operation by each of their pilots. This was followed by a photo op with the airplane. The flights were 15-20 minutes long traveling southwest over Folsom reservoir and returning back to KAUN.

In the EAA hangar, Chapter 526 President **Jack Prock** had his computer linked to a big screen TV with the *Flight Radar24* aircraft tracking program operating. This enabled the parents to watch the flights in real time flying in and out of KAUN. **Keith Leafdale** had the chapter's flight simulator available for the participants to

practice flying a Cessna aircraft prior to and after their airplane ride. **Tom Dwelle** stopped by with a few guests to check out the Young Eagles program. These visitors flew the simulator under Keith's direction and received a few good flying tips from Tom as well.

Marleen Wekell assisted by Carol Burns signed in the children and made sure all of the paperwork was correct. Maynard Smith and Don Wolfe assigned the youth to the flights and insured that each one had a flight log book. First time flyers received an EAA First Flight Certificate. Many of the kids presented their personal EAA logbooks to the pilots for signatures and logging of the flight observation time. Several

of the Young Eagles are "regulars" at these events and have numerous flights in several types of airplanes.

The pilots participating in the event were: **Don Burns**, **Mark Cloverdale**, **Greg "Zippidy" Duda**, **Doug Fee**, **Steven Kendall**, **Mark "Mac" McElroy**, **Doug McDougall**, and **Tim Sullivan**.
The pilots donated their time, fuel and aircraft to this worthy cause and they made every flight a positive experience for their passengers.

Steven Kendall and Marleen Wekell did another outstanding job of organizing this Young Eagles Day event. Their efforts included setting up the hangar, insuring that refreshments were available, completing the documentation required by EAA National and cleaning up when the rally was complete. The tireless energy and dedication given by Marleen and Steven in making these events successful is appreciated by all.
