



Thank you to our Local EAA Chapter 526!

During the discussion on our visibility sensor at the 5AC Meeting, Steve Kendall mentioned that the EAA Board had approved the expenditure to purchase a new video camera. It will have a view of the airport that to help supplement and confirm the information that pilots are getting from AWOS as visibility. The EAA plans to make access to the camera public. Airport webcams are available across the U.S. and now KAUN will have its own. It should be up and running in the next several weeks. We'll make an announcement when that happens. Links to the camera will be available on the EAA, AAA and City websites.

AOPA Airport Support Network

Mark Bateson is the new Auburn AOPA Airport Support Network (ASN) liaison. The AOPA ASN is a group of volunteers dedicated to promoting and protecting community airports. The program's goal is to have an ASN volunteer liaison at every public-use airport in the country to serve as an "early warning system" for local airport issues. Mark lives in Roseville, earned his PPL through Sunshine Flyers. Mark owns a C-172 that's on the east end ramp. You may have seen him from time-to-time at the airport over the last 20 years on his motorcycle or shooting photos. I've seen a guy on a motorcycle in full riding gear coming out to the airport for as long as I've been at the east end, but never had the opportunity to meet him. We are excited to announce the 2021 Scholarship season is upon us. Applications will be open on December 1, 2020 with interviews slated for February and March 2021. Auburn Aviation Association has teamed up for the second year with KAUN EAA Chapter 526 to conduct the application and interview process.

Six scholarships are available for 2021! There are four flight scholarships and two paid reservations at the EAA Advanced Air Academy at Oshkosh.

The Scholarships are as follows:

- Col. C.E. "Bud" Anderson Flight Scholarship
- EAA Chapter 526 Flight Scholarship
- Jason Randall Leys Flight Scholarship
- Flight Scholarship sponsored by Mach 5 Aviation
- EAA Advanced Air Academy Trip (2 awards)

The four flight training scholarships provide monies for pilot training to a maximum amount of \$2500 each*. The flight training must occur at the three flight schools located at KAUN Auburn airport. Students can train in fixed wing aircraft or helicopters and attend ground school training online. Any additional cost of instruction will be incurred by the students, their families, or support groups. Applicants must be age 16 to 23 as of December 31, 2021.

EAA Advanced Air Academy- Two applicants who will be age 16 to 18 as of July 20, 2021, will each receive full tuition (\$1605) to attend a one-week session of the EAA Advanced Air



Academy during July 2021. This summer camp is held at Oshkosh, Wisconsin. Airfare to and from either Green Bay or Appleton will be the responsibility of the student and his/her family. In a case of hardship, Chapter 526 will consider a request for financial aid for transportation.

Endowment Lands Major Donation

We are thrilled to report to you that the Auburn Aviation Association's Scholarship Endowment has just received a very large donation. CORE Placer Charter School recently made the decision to discontinue operations and their board of directors was holding internal discussions over what to do with the operational funds they had remaining. AAA member Mr. Noah Mackenroth, a member of the CORE Board, suggested that they contribute those funds to the AAA Endowment. After extensive discussions, debate, and research into AAA's mission, CORE donated

approximately \$88,000 to our endowment that is held by the Placer Community
Foundation. Mr. Mackenroth is the father of past AAA scholarship recipient **Renata Mackenroth**, as well as the son of an early AAA member **Jeb Mackenroth**.

"This is a game changer for us," said AAA Scholarship Chair, **Don Wolfe**. This donation will slightly more than double the size of our scholarship endowment and will enable us to substantially expand our outreach to Auburn area youth. This is going to necessitate some re-thinking of our future scholarship plans. It opens up

new scholarship opportunities for us, and the AAA board will need to decide exactly what direction we want to go with it. "I think it's very important that we put these funds to good use, and to justify the faith that CORE has put in us," stated past AAA President Doug Fee.

The AAA Board of Directors, and the entire association would like to very heartily thank Mr. Mackenroth for pursuing this, as well as CORE's Board for their extremely generous donation. We will endeavor to justify the trust they have put in the AAA scholarship mission.

This month we feature AAA Lifetime Members Joanie and Wayne Mooneyham. Their story begins in Hialeah, Florida where the Mooneyhams met at an outdoor roller skating rink. Joanie was 13 years old and Wayne was 16. For those of you familiar with auto racing, Joanie and Wayne roller skated and grew up with the famous NASCAR/ Indy Car Racer Donnie Allison.

Wayne's family was deeply involved with horses. His early teen years were filled with quarter horse riding and competitions. Showing a horse named "Blaze," Wayne won the Florida State Quarter Horse Championship at the young age of 14! This achievement in Florida began a long list of "podium finishes" for Wayne throughout his life.

The Mooneyhams married in Florida on May 27, 1962, promptly drove to California on their honeymoon, and have enjoyed 58 years of marriage on the west coast. Early in their marriage, Joanie would come to know just how passionate Wayne was about racing when they shared their first competitive sport together. The sport was "autocrossing" with their '57 Corvette. Wayne fabricated a special cushion for Joanie so she could sit higher and have better visibility. He made gas and clutch pedal extensions so she could reach and operate the controls. They competed for several years in autocrossing and both have lots of trophies from their efforts. Wayne was CA State

Champion in his class several years. Joanie did very well, too, but lost out to a Cobra in the final event!

After their kids got "out of the nest," they both continued to compete in various sports. While Wayne sailed Hobie Catamarans in competition around the world, Joanie took up trap shooting. She competed for several years including the National Trap Shooting Competition in Dayton, Ohio. Joanie garnered a collection of trophies and even did her own shell "reloading." Her favorite gun for competition was an over/under Perazzi 30" barrel. The "highlight" of her shooting career came in 1988 at the CA State Shoot. Joanie was "High Lady" shooting 97 (out of 100) at Handicap Yardage for 3 out of the 5 days of competition!

Those of us that know Wayne realize he is a very humble man and reluctant to share any of his accomplishments. That being said, Joanie is proud to point out that Wayne is the former National Hobie Cat sailboat champion in two separate classes.

He also raced in the Baja 1000 and Mint 400 in a car he personally built for off-road racing. Wayne and Sterling Holloway continue a gentleman's competition on the pool table even today. If you happen to challenge Wayne to a game of 8 ball, be



advised to take note of his smile as he "chalks up" the pool cue. I personally witnessed "the smile" a few years ago when Wayne and I discovered a pool table in the Lodge at Sulphur Creek, ID. We had a great time playing pool that day and I witnessed many of Wayne's great shots!

When it comes to flying airplanes, the Mooneyhams have been at it for quite a while.



Wayne's first flight was in December, 1958, in a Luscombe at Kendall Field just south of Miami. Two weeks later on January 1959, he soloed. Wayne's dad, an aircraft inspector for National Airlines, was instrumental in his introduction into flying. Wayne eventually was hired on with United Airlines as a DC-6 Flight Engineer in 1967 and retired from UAL as a 757/767 Captain in 1998. Wayne was able to achieve something very special by flying his retirement flight at United with son Mark serving as his co-pilot. Wayne continues to fly his 180 hp Super Citabria on local flights and to the Idaho back-country on an annual basis.

Joanie enjoys being a "back seat driver" when it comes to flying. She took lessons, went to ground school and received 11 hours of dual flight time but didn't pursue solo flight. After the kids were grown, she went to ground school again and remains happy in the backseat of the Citabria as the #1 co-pilot for Wayne.

Following Wayne's retirement from airline flying in 1998, Joanie continued to work as a realtor until 2003. They then moved from San Jose to Auburn and never regretted the change. Wayne continues his support of AAA and other non-profit organizations while Joanie keeps busy with AAA duties and as a Trustee on the Sutter Auburn Faith Hospital Foundation.

Wayne has served as AAA President twice when

the term was two years long and also was Chairman of the 5AC for several years. He now enjoys supporting AAA in "retirement" as a member, mentor and senior adviser.

Joanie is pleased to continue serving as the Secretary for AAA, a position she's held for several years. She was also instrumental in the success of several AAA fundraising events over the years. In Joanie's words, "Chairing the 2012 and 2014 'Thunder in the Sky' events is the highlight of my involvement. With an amazing team, many still members today, we put on successful and fun events - lots of work with huge rewards through amazing teamwork. The spirit of our organization has flourished over the years and the huge success of our scholarship program and establishing the PCF Endowment Fund shows the amazing commitment of our members to promote aviation for our youth."

In retirement Joanie and Wayne continue to enjoy their family and friends. They have two sons, daughters-in-law, 6 grandkids and 2 great grandkids and many, many friends. Joanie shares one of the secrets to a successful marriage: "One thing we have always done is 'never go to bed angry' - it's worked for 58 years and still goes!"

The Mooneyham's set an excellent example of having one's finest hour in retirement. Joanie and Wayne have proven time and again throughout their lives that setting goals and using one's competitive spirit to "stay the task" will result in success and completion of the goal. They've remained deeply involved in community programs, served as mentors in many capacities and are quick to step up to the plate in a leadership role when needed.
