As we get older, insurance costs tend to go up also, if you can even get insurance. Several people I know have sold their airplanes because they were not able to obtain insurance coverage. The WINGS programs or an annual Flight review may help to keep you in your airplane. As a flight instructor, this program could also help you with your flight review requirements.

Around the World Chipmunk by Dan Flom



One of the world's favorite military training aircraft is based here at Auburn/Lincoln, and recently had company from some British cousins.

The de Havilland Chipmunk was a basic trainer primarily used by the Royal Canadian Air Force, UK Royal Air Force, Portuguese Air Force and several other military forces around the world. Roughly 1300 Chipmunks were built between 1947 and 1957. They remained in service in the UK through 1996, and in Portugal as recently as 2018. Most have been decommissioned and sold off to private owners and flying clubs around the world.

In 1997, the Royal Air Force completed an Around The World (ATW) trip with two

Chipmunks. They departed England, flew across northern Europe, Russia, Alaska, Canada and back across the north Atlantic to England. One of the two aircraft that completed that trip is in the RAF Museum in London. The other aircraft happens to live in Southern California. Its owner, Richard, is passionate about maintaining its heritage. In June 2022 he intends to re-create the Canadian legs of that ATW trip, 25 years later to the day, with the very same aircraft, carrying the original pilot's paper navigation charts, flight suit, and helmet.

Richard, along with a second Chipmunk, and it's owner, Steve (also British) passed through Auburn in early May on the way to Canada.
