
# **As the Prop Turns**



# **Volunteer Positions AAA** By Chris Haven

I'm not the type to doggedly pursue a goal. If there are fun and friends involved, however, you can count me in. Continuing to show up as a AAA volunteer has brought me friendship, connections, belonging, accomplishment, and growth in skills I didn't have before. I encourage you to step up and get involved. Following is some information regarding the positions of AAA officers and directors.

The term of office for officers and directors is one year, minimum, starting in January of each year. Elections are held at the November meeting. <u>BYLAWS</u> can be found here.

#### Officers

The **President** presides at all General, Business and Special Meetings and be the principal agent in matters pertaining to liaison with government, commercial or private enterprises, except as hereinafter provided and coordinates the activities of the Corporation and serve as Chairperson of the Board of Directors. He or she is required to be a pilot, and will appoint committees as necessary to facilitate and expedite the aims and objectives of the Corporation.

The **Vice-President** stands in for the President when necessary, and is responsible for the general membership programs and the social events.

The **Secretary** keeps official records, with the exception of membership records, including minutes of all general, special and board meetings.

The **Treasurer** is the responsible agent for maintaining the corporation funds, receiving and disbursing all funds in accordance with bylaws. The treasurer prepares an annual budget for the corporation, obtains the approval of the Board of Directors, and presents it to the membership for a vote at the second General Meeting of the year. The treasurer is the responsible agent for the preparation and filing of the corporation's tax reports as required and providing written financial reports to members upon reasonable request.

#### **Directors**

**Newsletter** Director oversees production and distribution of a monthly newsletter or any other special communications as needed.

**Public Relations/Publicity** Director is responsible for maintaining good public relations with the local community and insuring events by AAA are given appropriate publicity and is responsible for management of the website at www.auburnaviationassociation.org.

**Membership** Director maintains an accurate record of all members, collects dues from membership, updates the membership records, and produces the member roster.

**Chairperson 5AC** presides at all meetings of the Auburn Aviation Association Airport Advisory Committee and is the formal agent in matters pertaining to liaison with the Airport Manager concerning 5AC issues.

**Scholarship** Director selects and chairs the Scholarship Committee, contacts the schools in early fall with information and applications for the scholarship program and administers and oversees the scholarship process.
