


intense most days, and that is certainly a welcome relief for all sorts of good reasons.

The Recreational Aviation Foundation preserves, improves and creates airstrips for recreational use throughout the USA. The "signature airport" for the R.A.F. is Ryan Field (2MT1) just east of Kalispell MT. This airport was donated to the R.A.F. by **Ben and Butchie Ryan**.



On Friday September 24,2021 AAA members **David "Stick" Holloway, Brice "Corky" Corcoran** and I flew to Ryan airfield in 2 Cessna Skywagons to join an RAF work party securing the airport for the winter. We made fuel stops at Baker City OR (KBKE) and Kalispell MT (S27) prior to proceeding to Ryan through a mountain pass just east of Glacier Park International Airport. It was a beautiful fall day to fly with many views of colorful fall foliage along the way.

Tents were pitched in the late afternoon followed by hamburgers cooked on an old wood burning stove. After sunset the dark sky revealed numerous satellites and beautiful stars. What a show we enjoyed!

Early the next day we saddled up the Skywagons and proceeded south at low level. The goal was to fly along the infamous Chinese wall located at the continental divide. Winds over the mountain tops were in excess of 30 kts creating turbulence and drafts up and down. We were able to safely navigate the passage and view the 12 mile long

escarpment of rock with no problem. The rock formation was spectacular in the morning light and offered a nice photo op.

No flight out of Ryan Field would be complete without "bagging" a couple of local mountain airports on the return. We landed in Meadow Creek (0S1) and Spotted Bear (8U4) airports to check out the grass/gravel runways. At Spotted Bear a family of 6 walked over to see the airplanes. "Corky" put the children in the airplane and gave them a fine explanation of all of those fancy clocks, dials, switches and knobs. It is worthy of note that Corky was supposed to be showing off the KC-135 Tanker at the Sacramento City Airshow this weekend butthe aircraft was cancelled due to operational necessity. Brice made up for the loss of his "big moment" by showing off the Mighty Skywagons instead. Not a bad deal in my opinion.

Heading back we flew over the lovely Hungry Horse Reservoir and returned to RAF Ryan for lunch. Chow was followed by helping to cover irrigation ditches and other small tasks. That evening we were treated to a rib dinner and



excellent deserts in the beautiful RAF rustic beam barn. Chairman **John McKenna**, **Jr.** presented the work party with "RAF Getting' It Done" hats and noted to us 3 manly AAA members that 2 days of work was required to earn a hat. We were faithfully extended a hat pending a 50% credit for

1 day of work in the future which; "We are more than happy to complete Sir!" The spirit and comradery of the RAF organization is truly commendable. Check out all of their accomplishments atwww.theraf.org.

Sunday morning we packed up, said goodbye and flew over to Kalispell for fuel. After takeoff "Stick" led the flight down the western shore of Flathead Lake. Nearing Elmo, MT we hung a right and flew up a beautiful valley with spectacular farms. Climbing to altitude we proceeded to one of Oregon's little secrets, the town of Joseph. www.josephoregon.com. Airport (KJSY)

This little town is situated north of the Eagle Cap Wilderness and looks like a scene in Austria. There is a tramway to the top of Ferguson Ridge offering hiking trails with spectacular views of the Walla Mountains at in every direction. At 8,150' one can also see the states of Idaho and Washington. Hang gliders and parasail pilots launch from this point and fly for hours prior to landing near Wallowa Lake far below. We could even see our Skywagons parked on the airport ramp in the distance. Later that evening we enjoyed an excellent dinner of Calzone at The

Embers Brew house. Teresa, the owner was especially nice to the pilots from California.




Up early the next morning with David leading in "Skywagon Triple 1 79", Corky put that USAF training to use and joined up in formation for the flight south for a fuel stop in Burns OR (KBNO). Typical of General Aviation's Good fortune we enjoyed a headwind going both directions so we needed plenty of gas to make it home. Winds in

excess of 30 knots made for a bumpy ride most of the way but this did not dampen the enjoyment we all shared flying together on this trip.

At one point we watched a fighter plane arc away from us high above in the Juniper MOA. I said to David, "That fighter pilot probably sees us on the radar and is saying: OH NO, It's Stick, Wolfman and Corky!" We also listened to a Rancher on VHF 123.45 giving orders from his Cessna 180 to the cowboys below as they herded cows out of the timbers. We offered to join him but he said one Skywagon was
