66Tell me a war

story," my dad would say when I came back from a solo flight early on. This request taps into a valuable part of participating with the flying community: discussion.

Coming from a family with several pilots, there was ample aviation-relevant talk. I heard many protracted tales with hand motions and hyperbole, but also regular monitoring and discussion of the weather, constant references to aviation (and military) terminology, and more than the average young person's share of how things work mechanically.

Whether the details of a flight are harrowing, humiliating, or heroic, there's something to be learned from sharing them with another pilot. Taking a bit of time to recount the situation, go over the action step by step, deliberate what one did and should have done, and to have the opportunity to hear the opinion of more experienced pilots make for interesting and effective learning. Each month the AAA meeting creates an opportunity to listen and share with people who care about flying.

Talking about flying also gave me something to discuss with Dad. A Vietnam veteran and Air Force fighter pilot, he has more than his fair share of stories. Just check out his forthcoming memoir.

An Update From the Managers Desk of KAUN by Tyghe Richardson

Due to our amazing weather at the end of February and beginning of March we had an extremely large volume of helicopters utilizing our facility. As usual our airport was above the fog, below the clouds and just barely out of the snow. Many of the other airports in the area were overrun with an abundance of snow and were unable to accommodate any aircraft traffic. Pacific Gas and Electric utilized our field exclusively for its helicopter operations to assist in the restoration of power to our neighboring communities. We realize this was an inconvenience to many of our airport operations. I would like to take this opportunity to express the gratitude of the City of Auburn, PG&E, and of course all that received the benefit of a faster power restoration due to our airport's efforts. Thank you all for being a great group of aviators!

This month's meeting of the AAA will be the first meeting to utilize the new conference system in the Barnstormers room. This new conference system includes an 85-inch television monitor integrated with a wide-angle web camera and a very sensitive microphone. We've tested this equipment and hope that everyone will enjoy

and utilize the new system in the Barnstormers room.

As many of you have noticed we have updated the door locks on the pilot lounge and the main entrance in the terminal building. The code is now the CTAF with the O.

As the East End hangar project continues to grow closer to completion we have procured and programmed new gate cards for the East End gate access. If you need a gate card, please see me for the appropriate paperwork needed and a card.

This month the City of Auburn entered into a contract with Mead and Hunt Inc. for our on-call airport planning and environmental consulting services. Part of this contract will be a master plan update that is required by the FAA. We have completed this type of update many times since the field was first opened in the 1930's. Once the process gets under way we will be looking for input from the airport community. I am confident that everyone involved in the process wants to hear from you. Expect to see several more updates on this topic in the coming months.

I am currently in the office and on site at the

airport 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM Tuesdays and Thursdays and several other times throughout the week. As always please feel free to contact me with all questions. The door is always open!


PILOTS NEEDED



To start, **Meng L**. completed his commercial multi-engine add-on with **Jake Heppner** as his CFI and Dr. Jim Duvall as his examiner in our Tecnam, N976GV. **Chris G**. accomplished his first solo on February 2nd, the first solo in one of our Diamond DA-40s, N633DS, with his CFI **Sam Golding** cheering him on!


