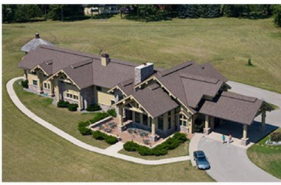

2023 EAA Air Academy Scholarships

One applicant who will be age 16, 17, or 18 as of July 28, 2023, will receive full tuition and up to \$600 in air fare reimbursement to attend the July 28 - August 5, 2023, session of EAA Advanced Air Academy.



These highly regarded summer camps are held at Oshkosh, Wisconsin, home of EAA AirVenture, the world's largest aviation event. Camp participants will be immersed in many aspects of aviation. AirVenture will be held July 24 - 30, 2023, and Advanced Air Academy participants will attend. Basic and advanced camps usually sell out months in advance. Chapter 526 has already secured the necessary slots for 2023.
