# An Update from the Managers Desk of KAUN by Tyghe Richardson

The East End Hangars are nearing completion, we expect that in the next 30-45 days the airport will start experiencing aircraft activity in the New East End Hangars. We should start hearing east end taxi calls shortly. We have had a very productive month on the



field. I can finally report that the asphalt is down and finished on the new helicopter pads! This phase of the construction was scheduled for 3 days. Due to the diligent and timely effort of the crews, the Airport users and management, we completed this task in 2 days. The crew was greatly appreciative of the effort that all the pilots

put forth to eliminate traffic congestion. We expect to have only a few more short closures or disruptions of taxiway Alpha. We will do are best to minimize the impact to the taxiway traffic.



Expect that we might see a few short Taxiway Alpha closures between June 1st and June 12th. If you happen to notice the lights on for 2 days on June 1st that will be the burn in of the light fixtures and is part of the project. The project is expected to have final clean up and be officially opened on June 12, 2023! I am happy to report that the open-door policy is working well, it has even created a new section of this article. The Squawk Section is

now open and is based on items that have been brought to my attention by several pilots or airport users.

#### **RUNUPS, WARMING UP, AND TAXIING OUT**

Several airport regulars have brought up the issue of propwash and the damage it may cause. This is an ongoing issue on the field. FAR 91.3(a) makes a very open statement regarding a pilot's responsibility for the operation of the aircraft. Most of us feel this includes propwash or damage it may cause. Please be cautious of your propwash and what is behind you. Selecting the proper location and even direction of the propwash blast can be the difference between a good

day or damaging property.

#### **SPEEDING**

Several airport regulars have brought the issue of speeding cars on the airport to my attention. Please remember that we are on a very active airfield, and we encourage a lively and welcoming environment for aviation enthusiasts. For safety reasons the speed limit is set to 15 MPH on the airfield. I personally aim for 10 MPH and find that to be a safe speed.

# As the Prop Turns by Mike Duncan

Laser lights at night. Laser light shows at night are wonderful to look at with all their pretty colors. Lasers are even great pointers in a slide show. They are not so great when pointed at aircraft. In fact they are illegal and can get you put in jail. During the past month there have been numerous reports of someone pointing a laser at aircraft approaching the Auburn airport. ATC and the CHP have been notified and are working to catch the culprit.

Last year I had a laser pointed at me coming into Auburn. I notified the CHP and the guys on the ground notified the helicopter that was flying. The officers had an approximate position of the laser when they came into Auburn. Sure enough as they approached the airport they got hit by the laser and

with the equipment they had on board they were able to pinpoint the location and catch the culprit. I found out later on that he was arrested and had all of his guns impounded. If you ever see a laser please report it to ATC and if able go over to the CHP office and knock on the door on the north side of the building and let them know. They want to catch them as much as you do.

The city has completed the helipads at mid field. They rebuilt the two existing pads and then added two more for a total of four pads. Actual construction did not take that long (about six weeks if you consider the weather delays) but the whole project was over two years in planning and grant approvals.

The students are still working hard. Matthew
Willey soloed in the LSA at Lincoln with David Longo
as his instructor. Both Kristen Kopp and Tenley Ong
earned their Instrument Rating with Steven Bazor as
their instructor. Tenley is one of our scholarship winners
who just started her flight training last June and

For initial solos, **Michael P**, took his first solo flight on April 27th as a student of **CFI Brian Reina** in N154DS. Awesome job, Michael!
























Reina would also conclude **Shiraz S.'s** multi-engine instructor training with Dr. Duvall on the 22nd!


