An Update From the Managers Desk of KAUN by Tyghe Richardson

A little about
me; I grew up in
Auburn and around
the Auburn airport.
I am a graduate of
Sierra College and
C.S.U. Sacramento,
where I earned my
AA in General
Studies and a BA in



Art and Photography, respectively. I attended and graduated from the Western College Of Auctioneering in Billings, Montana. I am a licensed private pilot with an instrument rating and roughly 500 hours of flight time. I received both my private pilot license and my instrument rating at the Auburn airport. We own and pilot a Mooney M-20-J 201 based and hangared at the Auburn airport. When not flying or working I

enjoy assisting with the maintenance of our aircraft with my AMP's supervision of course.

I spent the past few decades in real estate and offer a vast knowledge of the real estate market and the economics surrounding it. I've spent much of my real estate career managing property, selling property, negotiating and reviewing leases, and managing leases. This career change and position managing at the Auburn airport allows me to bring two of my passions together. I'm extremely happy that the city of Auburn and the hiring panel selected me to step in and manage the Auburn airport. I'm looking forward to the opportunity to navigate all aspects of the Auburn airport for many years to come.

In my short time in this position, I have noticed that one of our biggest needs is noise abatement education. Having the opportunity to see the documentation used to design the noise abatement procedure has given me a new

understanding as a pilot of its importance, and what went into selecting the 230 deg track from 25. To accomplish the goal of noise abatement education the 5 AC and the city have been working on updating and clarifying our noise abatement brochure. This update should be published soon. If you would like to see the data behind it, I have a wonderful PowerPoint available for your review or I would be happy to present it to a group for discussion. Please let me know if you would like to schedule a presentation.

Prior to accepting this position, I had no idea how much funding the Federal government provides to airports. All of this funding is managed through the FAA and its grant management systems. As we all know the FAA is very detailed and thorough. I have been working with Jonathan Wright, the FAA, the FAA SFO-ADO, and our consultants to ensure and secure continued project funding and keep our airport improvement projects moving forward. In the last month we have interviewed environmental and engineering companies to

ensure that the Auburn airport received the best design review and environmental work available. The next few months will hold a lot of paperwork, grant submission, project and proposal reviews and other such processes to continue our grants. Coming up in the next year we will be holding meetings regarding the airport and its master plan update. We will be soliciting the input of airport stakeholders to accomplish this update.

The new helicopter pads will be completed in the next few months. The contractors are currently waiting for the weather to be accommodated for the asphalt to be laid. If you have a plane in a tie down your March invoice will include a notice informing you that our maintenance team will be performing crack sealing. Prop wash and the April invoice will contain proposed dates for the crack sealing project. The dates will be subject to change based on the weather. As most of you know the pilot lounge now has a coded lock for after hours pilot access. We are working in the airport manager's office. We are updating the office in the next few

weeks, my office hours will become regular at the airport starting in March. My initial schedule will be Tuesday and Thursday mornings at the airport the balance of the week I will be in City Hall. I am always available for meetings at the Airport or City Hall. It is the intention of the City and my intention to have an open-door policy. Please don't hesitate to stop in with questions or concerns any time. If for some reason I'm not available at that time, please feel free to reach out via phone or email. The airport office's phone number is (530) 888-8174. If your item needs considerable time, we should make an appointment so we can concentrate on that matter and give it the attention it deserves.

As The Prop Turns by Mike Duncan

Well Valentine's Day has come and gone. Hopefully, you and your Valentine had a wonderful day. St. Patrick's Day is not far behind. Rainbows, green beer, leprechauns and a pot of gold may be in your future. That pot of gold for many of you might be in the form of our scholarship program which gives out tens of thousands of dollars each year to those deserving folks to advance their ambitions in aviation. This opportunity will close at the end of the month, February 28, 2023, to qualify for the Auburn Aviation Scholarship for this year. Additional scholarships are available through the Reno 99's (closing date March 3), The Golden Empire Flying Club, out of Nevada County Airport (apply between 1 Feb 2023 and April 30, 2023), and the AOPA (Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association).

Our accomplishments for this month are few but

pretty amazing. Kirk Belding was able to solo in a Cessna 172 at Auburn. Kirk followed his son Phoenix Belding who soloed a few weeks earlier; too late for our last newsletter. Both have Steve Bazor as their instructor. Dillon Holloway was able to solo on his sixteenth birthday. Not only was he able to solo on his birthday but he soloed in TWO airplanes. Most people only managed to solo one airplane and a tricycle airplane at that. Dillon soloed in a Citabria 7KCAB and a Cessna 185.

Both airplanes are conventional landing gear aircraft (tailwheel airplane). Dillon has been flying with his dad for a number of years in these airplanes and got the bug to fly. With the help of Don Wolfe* and Kelly Richards to get through the official training required and logbook endorsements he was able to solo. On February 19th, 2023 they all met early on a beautiful Sunday morning to celebrate his birthday. Dillon pre-flighted both aircraft and chose the "Beast" (Cessna 185) to fly first. A quick flight with Don Wolfe*



to settle down both Dillon and Don and Dillon was off. A cautious first take off and nice pattern to a perfect three point (full stall landing) to a full stop to a great relief to all. Don could now resume breathing. Dillon followed that with two more take offs and lands, each with a little more confidence. Now it was time for the Citabria. A much lighter airplane with a stick and tandem seating. He accomplished three landings in the airplane with ease; two full stall landings and a nice wheel landing to end his first solo. Now onto the birthday cake.

*Don Wolfe is a retired military and airline pilot and a CFI with thousands of flight hours. On this day, February 19,2023 Don soloed his first student as a flight instructor. In a way it is the first solo for both Dillon and Don; so we took both of their shirttails.

Well that is all for this month, so Good Night Miss Daisy.




Bronze monument of Col. Bud Anderson and his P-51 Mustang "Old Crow" created by Douglas Van Howd and installed at the Auburn Airport
